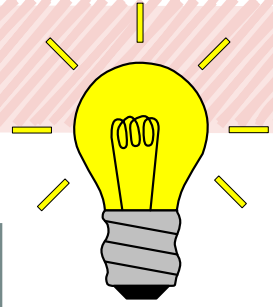

Comperative Adjectives

 Beth: „They're **hungrier than** we are.

*Comparative adjectives are used to show change or make comparisons. And to compare things we use **than**.*

Structure:

> Adjectives with one syllable:

— We add **-er**

hard - harder small - smaller

> Adjectives with one syllable ending in **-e**:

— We add **-r**.

wide - wider large - larger

> Adjectives ending in a vowel + consonant:

— We double the consonant and add **-er**.

fit - fitter big - bigger

> Adjectives ending in a consonant + **-y**:

— We change **-y** to **-i** and add **-er**.

happy - happier muddy - muddier

> Adjectives having two or more syllables:

— We use **more** before the adjective

more beautiful **more** amazing

Be careful of irregular comparative forms:

far - **farther** | **further** good - **better** bad - **worse**

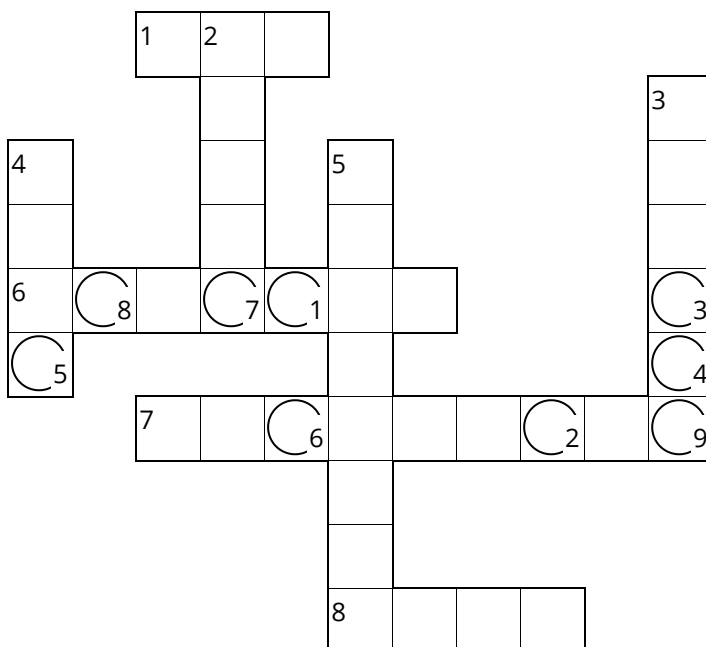
