(5) Can you remember? - Part 1

- One of Australia's most famous buildings constructed by the Danish architect Jorn Utzon.
- Australia's largest inland city, population: about 430.000, capital of Australia
 - One of Sydney's most famous sights, built in 1932. Nickname: The Coathanger
- A collection of limestone stacks off the shore of Port Campbell National Park in the province of Victoria.
- A large red rock formation, 863 m high. 450 km away from Alice Springs, holy to the Aborigines
 - Big well-known coastal city. Population: about 1 million
- Area around the cities. Not as far out than 'the outback'.
- Unusual rock formation in the Blue Mountains of New South Wales. Located close to the town of Katoomba.
 - The world's largest coral reef system composed of over 2,900 individual reefs and 900 islands. About 2,300 km long.
 - Big well-known coastal city. Population: more than 5 million. Capital of New South Wales.
 - Spectacular rock formation made of several round granite boulders. Holy to the Aborigines.

 - Desert town in the outback of Australia in the Northern Territory.
- Mammal with a long, tube-like mouth, covered in spines.
- Mammal that lays eggs and lives in rivers and on river banks.
 - Short-legged, muscular marsupial of about 1 m length which is native to Australia.
- Aboriginal art using stones and sand, used for ceremonies.
 - A tool originally used by the Aborigines to hunt animals.
 - Large World-Heritage listed sand island, located in Queensland.
 - Wild Australian dog living in packs. •
 - White, grey or black parrot with some coloured feathers.
